We are heartily thankful to our state's dynamic Chief Minister Dr. Himanta Biswa Sharma and his government for taking the necessary steps to provide us land and grants for construction in the new campus at Teok Kaliapani where the progress is on for construction of academic, administrative and hostel buildings. It is a campus of 57 bighas at Teok, 10 bighas in the Sensuwa Gaon adjacent to the 19 bighas of land on the existing campus which total up to 86 bighas. The entire fraternity of Assam Women's University shall always remain grateful to the Government of Assam, and in the history of the University this step on part of the Government shall always be a moment to cherish now and in the days to come.

Most importantly our teaching and non-teaching members contribution to the University is immense. In fact, they have held the reins of the University.

We have built up our Institutional Development Plan which highlights Assam Women's University Action Plan and Goals under NEP 2020 clearly indicating strategic plan and initiatives/action plan, comprising of short-term goals, mid-term goals, and long-term goals.

Assam Women's University is the only women University in the entire north-east and one of the eighteen (18) women University in the entire nation. Assam Women's University (AWU) is now well into its ninth year of existence.



From the moment when the Government of Assam passed the Assam Women's University Act in 2013, and notification of the first Statutes of the university on 6th April 2022 has come over time to symbolize the hopes and aspirations of thousands of women across this region. As the only women's university in North East India, the institution occupies a strategic plank in the expansion of reach and access of higher education among different strata of society. Our aim at Assam Women's University has always been to create quality and empowered human resources who can contribute to different arenas of society, industry, education, and professional life. Around 1300 students have so far passed out from the fifteen departments of our university. All of them, I believe, are doing well for themselves, as they face and grapple with the challenges of today's world and life.

At present, Assam Women's University has fifteen (15) departments under Five Schools viz, School of Human Sciences, School of Social Science & Humanities, School of Media, Technology and Information Sciences, School of Languages and Literature Studies and School of Management Sciences with 849 students in total. The literature and languages departments like Assamese and English is providing excellent skills to the students in equipping them with critical language and analytical capacities. In the social sciences, departments of Sociology, Political Science and Economics is empowering students with the necessary knowledge base required to understand socio-political and economic realities. Professionally oriented departments like Business Administration and Mass Communication are adding to the mix by training the students with a focus on making them industry ready. Information is knowledge, as they say, and the departments of Computer Science & Technology, Library Science and Education are contributing in making the students information literate and tackle the challenges in the current educational ecology. Psychology and Physiotherapy are training young minds in their respective disciplines which are fast becoming basic life-skills in today's times. From this year all the departments shall start the programmes in consonance with NEP 2020 to meet professional and skill enhancement demands from the learners. The Department of Business Administration shall start an exclusive MBA program for working professionals. We are also exploring the avenues to start Ph.D. Programs in various disciplines to add to the repertoire of Assam Women's University. As an additional optional subject, NCC is also being introduced in the undergraduate programmes in our university. We also have a faculty with NCC "C" Certificate holder and she has been nominated as CTO of our University. As part of National Service Scheme (NSS), our students are providing yeoman services amongst distressed communities which are immensely contributing to their personality development and sense of ethical citizenship. In line with the Govt. of India's Azaadi ka




Amrit Mahotsav and Atma-Nirbhar Bharat Program, Assam Women's University has celebrated and took part in a series of lectures and activities. The students have registered in the Academic Bank of Credit.

Under CSR initiative BCPL has provided us with an ambulance and NRL has given a fund with which we have built up an Audio-Video Lab under the Department of Mass Communication and Journalism.

To further our long-term goals in this regard, we have introduced Gender Studies as a core paper in the all the departments since last year as per a UGC directive. AWU is readying itself for an imminent NAAC peer team visit, so be rest assured that we are taking this challenge head on and seeing to it that the institution clears the accreditation with flying colours. To expedite the growth process of AWU, we are working relentlessly in the last couple of years. At present all the departments have student intake capacity of 35 but due to infrastructural limitations we are not able to increase our enrolment rate. With the new AWU campus coming up at Kaliapani, Teok, the university is now poised to see greater infrastructural facilities in the near future. We are hopeful that logistical and infrastructural issues will be overcome by then to effectively meet NEP guidelines.

A university in the contemporary era must be tuned to the changing socio-economic realities and challenges. It also has to come into collaborations with other centres of learning to exchange knowledge and thus stay relevant in a rapidly evolving pedagogical and technological environment. I am happy to share with you all the MoUs AWU has recently entered into with various reputed institutions. The organizations with which the MoUs have been signed include Sri Sri Aniruddhadeva Sports University, Educational Multimedia Research Centre (EMRC), Dibrugarh University, National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology, Guwahati, Regional Institute of English-North-East, ISchool, Save the Children (Bal Raksha Bharat), and FIPRESCI-India, Kolkata. We are always grateful to Assam Agricultural University for providing immediate services and facilities in times of need.

Assam Women's University aims to always provide a safe, secure and a free environment to its students. To build confidence, our university has recently established different cells and committees for counselling from stakeholders and to address issues and grievances alike. 1. THE UNIVERSITY

The Assam Women's University is the first state women University in the entire North Eastern Region of India which started functioning from the month of September, 2014. The University has been established by an Act (XXII) of 2013 of State Legislature of Assam as a State University vide Notification LGL.149/2011/92 dated 21.08.2013 and is empowered to award degrees as specified by the UGC under Section 22 of the UGC Act 1956 through its own departments. The main objectives of the University are as follows.

- a) To provide for facilities and offer opportunities to women for education in applied arts, technology, industry, commerce, management, applied sciences and social science by instruction, training, research, development and by such other means as the University may deem fit;
- b) To promote research in applied science and arts, technology, industry, commerce, management and social science for the advancement of knowledge and

for the betterment of the society particularly with focus on women's perspective;

- c) To devise and implement programmes of education for women in applied science, arts, technology, industry, commerce, management and social science that are relevant to the changing socio-economic needs of the society, in terms of breadth of diversity and depth of specialisation;
- d) To serve as a centre for fostering co-operation and exchange of ideas between the academic and research community on the one hand and industry on the other;

Organize exchange programme with other institution of repute into India and abroad with a view to keeping abreast of the latest development areas of teaching and research.

1.1. MISSION

The mission of the university is to provide a level playing ground for the women of Assam with respect to accessing higher education for promoting their knowledge, competitiveness and skills so as to make them capable

citizens to fill up the women talent gap in different spheres of societal, scientific, technological and other areas.

The ultimate goal of the University is to produce 21st century women knowledge and think-tanks to effectively

carry forward the women centric opportunities in the state of Assam and to become a matching partner in national and global development.



2. THE UNIVERSITY CAMPUS

The campus of the University is located at Rowriah, Jorhat, Assam which is seven (7) km away from ISBT, Jorhat, one (1) km from the Rowriah airport, Jorhat and seven (7) km from Jorhat railway station. Jorhat can be reached easily from Guwahati, the gateway to North-East India by bus / train / air.

3. PROGRAMMES OFFERED

At present, the university offers under graduate, post graduate programmes, diploma programmes and certificate courses, each with a capacity of Thirty (30) seats (Few UG programmes has Twenty (20) seats). 8. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

During the session 2023-24, Assam Women's University offers three (3) diploma, six (6) under graduate and fifteen (15) post graduate programmes. Admission will be purely on merit basis following the reservation system of the Government of Assam. Intake capacity for each programme will be of 30 Regular Seats (*few programmes have 20 Regular Seats*) and 5 Higher Fee (Endowment) Category Seats. Following are the eligibility criteria of the offered programmes.

- Only female candidates are eligible for admission.
- A candidate applying for undergraduate programme shall have to be at least 17 years of age as on August 1, 2023 (i.e., must have been born before 01-08-2006).

2. Supernumerary seat in each programme (Diploma, UG and PG) of the university will be created to accommodate the children who have lost both the parents during the COVID pandemic (vide UGC's D.O. No. F.@-39/2022 (CPP-II) dated 30th March, 2022).

8.1. PROCEDURE FOR HOLDING ENTRANCE EXAMINATION

- a) The Assam Women's University Entrance Test (AWUET-2023) shall take place in four (4) major cities within the state of Assam namely: Jorhat, Dibrugarh, Tezpur and Guwahati.
- b) For **Bachelor of Physiotherapy**, questions will be on Physics, Chemistry, Biology and English from 10+2 level syllabus. The qualifying marks of the entrance test for the Department of Physiotherapy is 50%.
- c) For **BA in Psychology** and for **PG programmes**, the mode of selection will be based on Assam Women's University Entrance Test (AWUET) to be notified on a later date. Candidates are advised to visit the university website frequently.
- d) The final merit list will be prepared based on the academic performance of the candidate and the marks scored in the entrance examinations conducted by the respective departments.





9. SELECTION & ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Candidates will have to appear personally before the Selection Committee (subject to change) at their own expense, on the scheduled date of admission.

9.1. RESERVATION OF SEATS

The University makes provisions for reservation of seats as per Government of Assam norms for eligible candidates belonging to the following categories. Certificates from the competent authorities against each of the reserved categories must be enclosed along with the filled-in application form. Self-attested copies of certificates mentioned against each of the categories must be submitted along with the online application form, the original of which has to be produced at the time of admission.

a) Scheduled Caste specified in relation to the state of Assam under Article 341 of the Constitution of India. (Certificate from the competent authority countersigned by the Deputy Commissioner / Additional Deputy Commissioner).

- b) Scheduled Tribes (Plains and Hills) specified in relation to the state of Assam under Article 342 of the Constitution of India. (Certificate from competent authority countersigned by the Deputy Commissioner / Additional Deputy Commissioner).
- c) Other Backward Classes (OBC) / More Other Backward Classes (OBC) specified in relation to the state of Assam. (Certificate from competent authority countersigned by the Deputy Commissioner / Additional Deputy Commissioner).
- d) Persons with Disabilities as per provisions of Section 32 under Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016. (Certificate from competent authority countersigned by the Deputy Commissioner / Additional Deputy Commissioner).

9.2. ADMISSION OF FOREIGN / NRI STUDENTS

Foreign candidate seeking admission shall forward their application through their respective Embassy / Mission at New Delhi or through the respective Indian Missions abroad to the Government of India / University Grants Commission (UGC) and their candidature shall be



considered if they are sponsored / cleared by the Government of India / UGC. Necessary fees shall be charged at the rates prescribed by the UGC for the foreign candidates which is three times of the admission fees in each semester for the respective discipline. Eligibility for admission of foreign students is as per qualification prescribed by the University. A good knowledge of English language is essential. In addition to this, students are required to be registered in the Education India portal (<https://educationindia.gov.in/>).

9.3. DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION OF FOREIGN / NRI STUDENTS

- a) Visa: All the international students will require a student visa endorsed to this Institution for joining full time courses. No other endorsement is acceptable. The visa should be valid for the prescribed duration of the course. Visa is not required for NRI students.
- b) All international students will have to obtain prior security clearance from the Ministry of Home Affairs and the approval of Department of Secondary &

Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development Government of India.

- c) A certificate of candidates' proficiency in English issued by the respective Indian Mission abroad and recognized agencies should be submitted.
- d) EII Registration Certificate/Receipt.

9.4. ADMISSION

Admission of a candidate to a Programme is subject to the following conditions:

- a) Fulfilment of the eligibility criteria as specified in Eligibility Criteria for Admission.
- b) Selection for admission to the Programme.
- c) Production of all the relevant documents such as pass certificates and marksheets of all earlier examinations with requisite percentage of marks in original and original copies of documents uploaded at the time of submission of the application form.
- d) Submission of a set of self-attested copy of all pass certificate, marksheets and other the relevant documents.



- e) Submission of the character certificate from the Head of the Institution and Migration certificate (in original) from the Board / University last attended.
- f) Submission of a self-attested printout of the filled-in application form.
- g) **Receipt of payment of admission fee in full.**

9.5. PROVISIONAL ADMISSION

- a) If the result of the qualifying examination of a student is awaited at the time of admission, she must produce/submit pass certificate/marksheet with requisite percentage of marks within 30th October, 2022. Such a candidate must submit a proof of taking all the examinations including practical/lab/project/backlog courses of the qualifying Degree/Diploma/Certificate at the time of admission duly certified by the Head of the Institute last attended. If any backlog course or other component remains incomplete after admission, then the candidate will be treated as not qualified for continuation and will be asked to leave the programme.

- b) If a candidate fails to produce / submit any document (such as the completion certificate and mark sheet/transcripts of the qualifying examinations, migration certificate from the Board/University last attended, etc.) at the time of admission, the same must be produced as early as possible but not later than **30th October, 2023**.
- c) Candidates failing to produce marksheet or pass certificate with requisite percentage of marks within the specified period will not be allowed to continue her study.

9.6. PERMANENT RESIDENTIAL CERTIFICATE

All candidates (*except foreign nationals*) must submit the **Permanent Residence Certificate (PRC)** issued by the competent authority (Deputy Commissioner / District Magistrate / SDO Civil) of the Government.

9.7. GAP PERIOD CERTIFICATE

If a candidate discontinues her studies after the qualifying examination, she shall have to furnish a gap period certificate only from the institute last attended at the

time of admission.

9.8. PHYSICAL FITNESS CERTIFICATE

The candidate shall have to submit a duly filled-in prescribed format (*Annexure-1*) at the time of admission.

9.9. ANTI-RAGGING AFFIDAVITS

Indulging in ragging inside or outside the University campus is punishable. Students are advised to visit www.ugc.ac.in or www.awu.ac.in for UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009. The students and parents must submit a duly notarised anti-ragging affidavit as per the format given on the website under **Download Forms** section.

9.10. PAYMENT OF FEES

Subject to physical fitness of the candidates, being declared as such by the Medical Officer / Medical Board, an eligible candidate has to take admission on payment of prescribed fees immediately after selection. **Fee Waiver scheme is applicable for candidates belonging to BPL category.**

12. LIBRARY

The **Central Library** of Assam Women's University was established since the inception of Assam Women's University in 2014 but it started functioning in 2015. 13. TEACHING

13.1. CBCS & CONTINUOUS ASSESSMENT

The AWU has followed the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) and Continuous Assessment in a semester in consonance with NEP 2020. These are the important components of reform in higher education in India. In this Choice based credit system, students are given opportunities to pursue courses of interest across discipline and schools in addition to their major course of interest.

The number of credits in a course is closely related to the number of teaching-learning hours and the flexible curriculum enables students to pursue courses of their interest and obtain inter-disciplinary expertise. Assam Women's University has also adopted the Lecture-Tutorial-Practical (L-T-P) structure which encourages students towards self-learning or learner centric approaches. The students have more opportunities to develop and nurture their creative abilities and are exposed to the methodologies of academic work.

Medium of Instruction is **English & Assamese**.

13.2. ACADEMIC YEAR

The academic year of the University is from August to July. The academic year consists of two semesters.

13.3. COURSES

During a semester, the students register themselves for a number of courses. A “Course” is a unit of instruction of a subject matter under any discipline carrying a specific number of “Credit Hours”.

13.4. CREDIT HOURS

“Credit Hours” Signify the quantum of work done corresponding to 1 hour of theory class or 2-3 hours of laboratory /field practical every week during a semester in respect of a particular course.

13.5. ATTENDANCE

A student is to maintain a minimum of 75% attendance separately for theory and practical in each course failing which she shall be debarred from appearing in the End Term examination.



14. EXAMINATION

Student performance for both Under Graduate (UG) and Post Graduate (PG) program shall be monitored throughout the semester by continuous assessment. There shall be university examinations (both theory and practical) at the end of each semester. But a continuous evaluation of students will be carried out by the course teachers during the progress of semester. The evaluation scheme for each course shall contain the following two parts.

- a) Internal evaluation carried out during the semester.
- b) External evaluation at the end of the semester.

Internal evaluation shall involve two written tests as notified in the academic calendar. External paper setters are engaged for external evaluation, i.e., end term examination.

15. CLIMATE

The climate of the state is pleasant for most part of the year. The winter lasts for about five months, viz., from October to February. Though summer starts from March-April, the weather is quite pleasant. There is heavy rainfall during the months of July and August.

16. DISCIPLINE

All students are to maintain discipline and proper scholastic atmosphere during their stay at the University. On admission, students must acquaint themselves with the University and hostel rules and regulations. Ragging is completely banned in Assam Women's University. Any student found involved in ragging shall be liable for stern disciplinary action as per the UGC Regulation on "Curbing the menace of ragging in higher educational institution, 2009".

17. STUDENTS' WELFARE

17.1. SPORTS, RECREATION & SOCIAL SERVICE

The University shall gradually provide facilities for games and sports, music, study circle, drama and other co-curricular activities for overall personality development of the students admitted.

17.2. MEDICAL FACILITIES

The University presently has an ambulance which is available 24x7 to facilitate students in commuting to and

from the university campus and JMCH, Jorhat in cases of emergency. First Aid Care is available. Additionally, an OPD clinic under the Department of Physiotherapy will be available soon.

17.3. STUDENTS MAGAZINE

There is provision for publishing a magazine to encourage creativity of the students. The students are to pay the magazine fee at the beginning of each academic year.

17.4. BUS FACILITY

Bus service is available for commuting between Jorhat Town and University Campus in scheduled times.

18. REFUND OF CAUTION MONEY

Refund of caution money shall be made to a student after her release from the University. The claim of caution money shall not be entertained beyond a period of one year from the date of release.

Release of caution money shall be made against application in prescribed form and production of release order. The caution money shall not be refunded if a student leaves the university without prior permission and/or does not join and attend any class after admission.
